### Musing From the Pastor

Hebrews 13:5b-6 God has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we may boldly say: "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

I remember a story of a man who was caught in a flood. He determined that he would wait on God to rescue him. Shortly after the man prayed for God's intervention a fireman came to his door to rescue him. The man

politely thanked the fireman but declared that God was going to rescue him. The waters rose higher and higher and the man had to climb up onto his roof. He prayed again for the Lord to rescue him and was confident that the Lord would answer his prayer. Shortly thereafter a man in a boat came by and offered to take the man to safety. The man thanked him but said confidently that he was going to wait on the Lord to rescue him. The flood waters rose higher and higher, almost covering the top of the house. Again the man prayed for God to rescue him and soon thereafter a helicopter came and hovered over the roof top. The pilot frantically tried to persuade the man to grab hold of the ladder and climb into the helicopter, but the man on the roof refused to leave, once again declaring that God was going to rescue him. Eventually the man was overtaken by the flood waters and drowned. When he stood before the Lord he asked in dismay why the Lord had forsaken him and not rescued him. The Lord said to him, "I sent a fireman, a boat, and a

helicopter. What more did you want?!"

While this story sounds absurd to us, many of us do the very same thing when it comes to receiving God's help. We miss the obvious because we are not willing to accept how God might choose to help us. When God promised to never leave or forsake us, He was telling us that He wouldn't leave us helpless, without a plan, a hope or a future. He was saying that if we would seek Him and trust Him, He would provide a way out for us. More often than not the way God provides for us gives us something to do in the process. That may mean anything from leaving an old job to giving up certain activities. To the degree we are willing to follow God's leading is the degree we will experience his provision and peace. Psalm 23:1 says that the Lord is our Shepherd and we shall not lack. As much as we love to relate lack to money and possessions, may I suggest to you that it also refers to ideas, wisdom, and strength? Could it be that God is trying to give us a plan to get out of some of our

troubles and we are ignoring Him because we are expecting Him to do it all? Could it be that there is something that we are supposed to do? Could it be that maybe, just maybe, God is trying to help us and we are refusing His help because it's not what we were expecting?

We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us when we are allowing Him to be in the lead! How much are you really leaning and relying on the Lord? How many ideas has He given you that you have just shrugged off because they seemed too hard or because you just couldn't believe that God would ask you to do such a thing? How many times have you waited on God and missed your part in the process?

God is on your side and He will not abandon you or leave you helpless. His Holy Spirit is in you to Help you in all things that He calls you to do. You will not lack anything when you allow the Lord to lead you and guide you. His ways are higher than ours because they work!

So before you miss the help God may be sending your way and drown in

your troubles, ask the Lord to open your eyes to see what He is sending to help you. Be willing to receive His help and to let go of how you think He should do things. Never doubt that God really is on your side and that He is your ever present help.

Prayer: Dear Lord, forgive me for holding onto my ways of thinking and missing your help. Open my eyes to see You and empower me to let go of my ways so that I can grab hold of your help and be willing to do whatever it is that you are asking me to. I can do all things that You call me to do because You will HELP me!! In Jesus Name, Amen.

## Seeing The Need

There's a power in us that God wants to awaken in our church family. His will is that we be united in our prayers. He sees the men praying at 6 a.m. daily, but there is a missing link for the prayers for our Pastors. "The Church

that prays together is the Church that will walk in faith together ". They will do great things for God simply because they only want his light to shine and his word to go forth. Love will move us to do more for God than ever before. While studying the Sunday school lesson for July 25, 2010; the writer opened a door of concern and a need that got my attention and my class members as well. It's simply this: "PRAY FOR YOUR PASTOR!" The writer shared how they went to visit a member that had recently returned home from the Hospital. ...As she left the room to get us some refreshments, she invited me to look at the list she kept in her Bible on the coffee table. When I looked in the Bible, I noticed that my name was at the top of her daily prayer list. How encouraging it was to me to know that someone was praying for me every day and for my effectiveness as a pastor." How can you teach without being touched by God to do more than just listen and tell others what to do. When we, his children, must strengthen the hands of our leaders by covering them with our

prayers. How should we pray for them?

1. Knowledge and wisdom that they be effective. Claim that they have an anointing from the Holy One and that they know all things. Today, Jesus is made unto them wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and redemption. Pastor King Harris and Pastor Jeff Kanost have the mind of Christ (1JH 2:20; ICOR1:30; 1Cor2:16 James 3:17).
2. Pray that they be filled with the knowledge of the Lord's will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding (Col 1:9).
3. Pray that they walk not in darkness. It has been given to them to know the mysteries of the kingdom. The Lord instructs my pastors and teaches them in the way they should go: He guides them with his eyes (Matt 13:11; Rom 1:19: Ps 32:8).
4. Pray that they rejoice in the Lord because they put their trust in his holy name. As they rejoice in the Lord, their soul will be joyful in their God; for He has clothed them with the garments of salvation. He has covered our pastors with the robe of

righteousness. The word unto them is joy and rejoicing of the heart, for they are called by your name O Lord God of Host (Jer 15:16 ).

5. Pray that they hear the voice of the Lord through his word. Therefore, our pastors will dwell safely and be quiet from fear of evil (Prov 1:33).

6. The Lord sent his word and healed them and delivered them from all destruction. They serve the Lord and he blesses their food and drink; and he takes sickness from our pastors and their family; He heals all their diseases (Ps107:20; Ex 23:25; Ps103;3b).

7. Father we thank you that our pastors and leaders are blessed because our God is the Lord and we are the people He has chosen for His inheritance (Ps 33:12).

If we continue to pray for our leaders daily the request we ask of God for them will also come on our life. We are to simply say to God; I will follow you as you lead my pastors. We do want them to be effective church leaders by under girding them daily in prayer. Pastors need to

know that they are not alone. The lord is with them, strengthening, guiding and empowering them. They can find comfort and fill God's presence in knowing that the faithful family of Epworth UMC are with them. Let's do it with PRAYER POWER!

## Around Town and Epworth.....

Though the date is uncertain, we do know that a deaconess by the name of Melissa Briggs set up a tent in lower downtown Denver in the early 1890s to minister in answer to her call to Christian service. And from her efforts, the Briggs Mission, the precursor to the Epworth United Methodist Church, had its beginnings at about 31st and Walnut Streets and later moved to 31st and Lawrence Streets.

It was the 31st and

Lawrence Street location that was the focus of the Joshua Walk. Pastor Harris would like to reclaim that location for Epworth. He feels that it is our true home and we should be in possession of it. However, there are two slight obstacles--an unfriendly real estate agent and a price tag of \$5 million which includes not only the church building, but also the old Denver Enterprise Center building and the property comprises an entire city block. Both are vacant and apparently have been for a good number of years and are in deteriorating condition. The church building was declared a historic landmark in 1999 and is a simplistic, uncomplicated, yet beautiful, Denver Square architecture, I think.

Pastor Harris feels that Epworth needs to reclaim our home and return there. Following the Joshua scriptures in the bible, these form the basis for his, he feels, rightful claim. And so, the Joshua walks began on Monday July 12th and continued for seven days. We gathered at the 31st and Lawrence Street site at 6p.m. for six days. On the seventh day, a Sunday, 3p.m. was the gathering time. The ceremonies began for

each of the seven days with a scripture and a prayer. The first day, Pastor Ralph Beechum of House of Joy Miracle Deliverance Church was our guest minister and Joshua Wilson, together with Jerry Morgan, served as drum majors. We peacefully and quietly--with the exception of the drums obviously--walked around the site once each day for six days. Then on the seventh day, Pastor Beechum and Pastor Mark Hill of Cleaves CME Church led the group in marching in total and complete silence--save only for the drums--seven times.

The entire seven days were a moving experience, not only for a worthy cause, but the discipline exhibited by all participants was indeed notable and impressive, especially among the youth. They were both compliant and quiet.

This was definitely a new and different experience for me and perhaps for others, I don't know. Pastor Harris is ready to take action; however, he says, God has told him to wait. "Wait, I say, on the Lord."

If it be God's divine will, we will re-capture our former home. We now await word from the Lord.

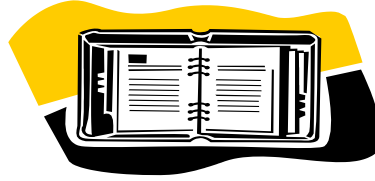

## **“The View From God’s Vantage Point”**

I am always amazed when taking a trip by air. I notice that, for the most part, almost everyone is anxiously waiting to board the plane. We all seem to be waiting with great expectations for the take off; for the ride in the air; and, finally, for the landing at our destination.

One of my favorite parts of the experience is the take off. Once all passengers are safely seated, buckled in, and given the safety briefing, the pilot tells us to “prepare for take off.” The

plane begins to back away from the terminal and journeys to the runway. After gaining the runway, the engines begin to power up; and the plane begins to pick-up speed. When the speed reaches a certain point, the plane begins to leave the ground. You can feel the lift as you no longer feel the runway—you are now in the air.

As you begin to ascend, you will notice everything on the ground begins to look smaller. The airport, buildings, cars, other planes, streets, highways—everything on the ground—now takes shape; and, in an instant, the view is different. The higher the plane rises in the air, the better everything looks on the ground. It’s like pieces to a puzzle. At first, from the ground, everything appears to be disjointed, overwhelming, and somewhat out of place.

But from the air, everything begins to make sense. As the plane continues to ascend, the highways, with their meandering curves; the buildings, with their neat alignment; and the architectural landscape, well-integrated with nature, all make sense. What an exciting thought to know that there is a reason for everything; and from the air, it all makes sense.

Our vantage point from the air is short-lived; and, for most of us, it can only be experienced from a plane. But the good news is that God's view from His vantage point is not short-lived. His view is clear all the time because He is here—above the clouds of our circumstances. He understands why there are curves in the roads of our lives. He is keenly aware of why the buildings in our lives can sometimes be overwhelming. God sits high above us to carry us through our journey of life so we can arrive safely at our destination. David says in Psalm 139:6-7: "Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain. Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?"

This is why it is so important for us to seek God for life's direction because our vision—at best—is limited. When we consult God, we can trust Him to direct our path simply because He can see what we can't (Proverbs 3:5-6).

So, the next time you become overwhelmed by your surroundings, or the highway of your life begins to take a turn—don't fret! Remember to look up and seek the One who can see the total picture of your life from His vantage point. God's view is much better from up there!
